VSP 2-YEAR REPORT

Asotin County's VSP (Voluntary Stewardship Plan) 2-year report was accepted by the VSP Work Group and submitted to the Conservation Commission on September 30th. The report highlighted the outreach and education that has been provided to the community. Benchmarks for protecting and enhancing critical areas are being met. Ag viability has remained the same since the plan was submitted in 2018. Numerous cost share projects have been implemented with the use of VSP funds.

Now Taking Tree Orders

Each year, we find it more challenging to secure desirable tree species and stock types for projects and the annual tree sale. With wildfires raging across the western United States, it is likely the challenge will be even greater for 2022!
