NEW EMPLOYEE

PROJECT OPPORTUNITIES

ACCD was awarded a grant by the Department of Ecology that will start January 1, 2022. The funding will target projects that protect and enhance riparian conditions and water quality. The Conservation District and Weed Board are excited to announce the 2022 Weed Control Programs that will be available.

The 2022 Cost-Share program is available for all Class B and C weeds. Treatment of Russian thistle is also eligible. There are two options available, but landowners may only participate in one of the options. Ground application will be 50% cost-share not to exceed a payment of \$50.00 per acre with a cap of \$400 per landowner. The Aerial applications will be 50% cost-share not to exceed a payment of \$25.00 per acre with a cap of \$1,250 per landowner. To apply for the cost-share program, applicants need to submit a map identifying the location of the treatment, number of acres that will be treated and

weeds that will be sprayed. If you need assistance with weed identification, ACCD technical staff can assist you. Acres enrolled in CRP, CREP and CCRP or acres in a cropping rotation are not eligible for the program. Landowners must have a weed management checklist and plan completed with ACCD to be eligible for cost-share.

There will also be funding available for the Early Detection, Rapid Response program. This program targets all Class A weeds and the following Class B weeds: orange hawkweed, meadow hawkweed, spotted knapweed, Japanese knotweed, and white bryony. This program covers 100% of the costs for treatment by a consulting contractor or conservation crew provided by ACCD. New this year, we will also provide reimbursement of 100% of the chemical cost if the landowner treats the weeds themselves. Landowners must provide written consent/agreement for treatment and allow monitoring of the infestation prior to treatment.

HOME IGNITION ZONE ASSESSMENTS

The district will be able to do “Firewise” type home assessments this fall and winter. Research around home destruction vs. home survival in wildfires point to embers and small flames as the main way that most homes ignite in wildfires. There are procedures for homeowners to prepare their homes to withstand ember attacks and minimize the likelihood of flames or surface fire reaching the home or any attachments. ACCD will plan to do a minimum of 10 homes (forested and rangeland/rural urban interface). Contact us if you’d like a free home assessment!
