

Austrian Pine

Pinus nigra

Distribution: Austrian Pine is not native to North America but is widely used throughout a very wide range of sites.

Growth: Austrian Pine is a dense and full upright evergreen. It can reach 50' tall and spread 20' wide.

Adaptability: Austrian Pine is a very adaptable conifer. It is both heat and cold tolerant. It grows in a wide variety of soils providing they are not too wet. It will tolerate soils that are close to saturation for short periods of time but are better suited to well drained soils. It grows most vigorously in sites with good exposure to the sun.

Comments: Austrian Pine has long been used as an ornamental species. It has also been used in numerous conservation practices over the years such as windbreaks. Its wide-spreading growth habit is well suited for providing shade for homes, buildings and livestock.
