

Oregon Oak

Quercus Garryana

Distribution: Oregon Oak is native to western North America. It can be found north to British Columbia to southern California. They are primarily found in the Cascade mountain range but there are populations scattered to the east.

Growth: The Oregon Oak is slow growing but can reach 60 to 80 feet tall at maturity.

Adaptability: This Oak is suitable for locations from full sun to partial shade and moist to dry soil conditions. It likes dry rocky slopes, bluffs and well drained soil.

Comments: White Oak trees provide excellent wildlife habitat. They produce tiny flowers and acorns in shallow, rough cups.
