#### Notice of Adopted Election Resolution

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the Asotin County Conservation District operates under the laws of the State of Washington applicable to conservation districts.

WHEREAS the District is governed by a five-member board, as set out in RCW Chapter 89.08 and WAC Section 135-110.

It is RESOLVED that a mail-in only election for an open position on the District board of Supervisors will be held on Thursday, March 18, 2021 and closes at 4:30pm at The Asotin County Conservation Districts office located at 720 Sixth Street, Suite B, Clarkston, WA 99403.

The elected position whose term is expiring in May 2021 is currently held by Rod Hostetler.

The appointed position whose term is expiring in May 2021 is currently held by Jason Schlee.

The new terms will commence May 2021 and expire May 2024.

Interested candidates must be registered voters who reside within the boundaries of the District. The filing deadline for candidates to file their candidate information is February 15, 2021 no later than 4:30pm. Interested candidates must file their candidate information at the Districts office at 720 Sixth Street, Suite B, Clarkston, WA 99403.

Eligible voters are registered voters who reside within the boundaries of the District. The last day and time that voters can request ballots from the District is February 25, 2021 at 4:30pm. Ballots can be requested by phone, mail or email from Asotin County Conservation District staff located at 720 Sixth Street, Suite B, Clarkston, WA 99403 - Tel: (509) 552-8117 email: <a href="mailto:info@asotincd.org">info@asotincd.org</a>. If a voter is returning a ballot by mail, the voter must account for the time it will take for the ballot to be returned to the district by mail. Ballots returned by mail must be post-marked no later than the Election Day, March 18, 2021. Ballots returned by other means must be returned to Asotin County Conservation District, 720 Sixth Street, Suite B, Clarkston, WA 99403 by March 18, 2021 4:30pm and may utilize the drop box located outside the District front door.

The election supervisor will be Colleen Ozard.

A conservation district supervisor is a public official who serves without compensation and who sets policy and direction for the conservation district.
