

Amur Maple *Acer ginnala*

Distribution: Amur Maple grows best in Zones 3-8.

Growth: Its mature height is 15 to 20 feet tall and 15 to 20 feet wide with an often multi-stemmed trunk and rounded crown.

Adaptability: Plant in full sun to light shade in a range of soil types. It is quite adaptable to a wide range of pH ranges but does best in well-drained soil. Tolerant of wind, dry soil, and drought. It withstands heavy pruning and can be successfully grown as a container plant. Easy to transplant and casts dense shade.

Comments: With its dense foliage it can be used for screening or mass plantings on blank walls of large buildings. The Flame cultivar is a large shrub with flaming fall color that can be planted in above ground containers.
